





The phrase "burned counties" was first used for research in Virginia where many county records were destroyed in courthouse fires, or during the Civil War.<sup>[1]</sup> The strategies for researching places where a local counthouse or repository was wiped out by fire, fornado, war, flood, hurricane, earthouse, insects, rodents, mold, neglect, foxing, theft, faunami, or cleaning-streak derks are useful in similar situations all around the United States, Canada, and throughout the world.


